

Special conditions for SSL Certificates

1.0 General

This agreement governs the relationship between ServeTheWorld (STW) and the Customer.

The purpose of this document is to establish the specific terms that apply to SSL Certificates. These specific terms supplement the general terms of the agreement. In case of conflict between the two, the specific terms take precedence over the general terms.

Matters not defined in the specific terms are subject to the General Terms and Conditions.

2.0 SSL certificate

An SSL certificate is a digital certificate that utilizes encryption to secure the transmission of data between a website and the user's web browser. This certificate contains a public key and may also include information about the owner, depending on the type of certificate. All SSL certificates are signed by a certification authority, which vouches for their authenticity. The purpose of the certificate is to ensure that data transferred between a server and a browser remains private and integrity-protected.

3.0 Right of Withdrawal

SSL certificates are provided for a minimum of one year at a time. There is no right of withdrawal for SSL certificates that have been delivered.

4.0 Liability

Under no circumstances can the Customer claim compensation beyond the amount paid for SSL in the last 12 months, calculated from the time liability was notified. Compensation does not cover liability for indirect losses, including lost profits, consequential losses, and other consequential damages. Claims for compensation must be made without undue delay.

STW is not liable in the event of Force Majeure.
